What is Radicalism?

Radicalism refers to the process by which a person comes to support terrorism and forms of extremism.

Protecting children from risk is seen as part of Hambleton's Pre-School's safeguarding duties to protect children and is similar in nature to protect children from other forms of harm and abuse.

During the process of radicalisation it is possible to intervene to prevent vulnerable children being radicalised

What is extremism?

Extremism is vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

Risk Assessment

All staff are able to identify children who may be vulnerable to radicalisation and know what procedure to follow.

Staff can demonstrate an understanding of the risks affecting children, how to identify individual children who may be at risk of radicalisation and what to do to support them.

With ongoing training in safeguarding staff are able to be alerted to changes in a child's behaviour indicating help or protection may be required that an individual may be vulnerable to being drawn into terrorism or extremism.

Procedure

Discussing concerns with their designated safeguarding supervisor.

Where deemed necessary:

Contact our local police 101 (non-emergency number)

Discussions can be made in confidence about any concerns where advice and support can be given and if necessary advise if this would be a case for Channel
